

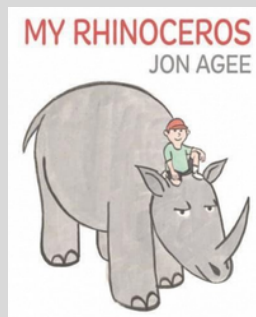

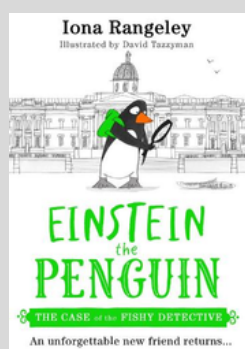
Year 1 and 2

When it's dark at night, we need light to see. But what if our bodies made their own? A remarkable new fiction text inspired by nature and the plants and animals that produce light.



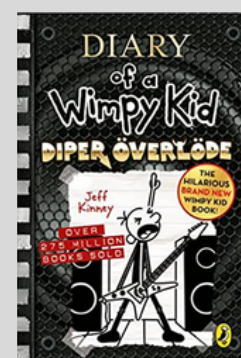
Year 3 and 4

Year 5 and 6

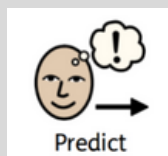
This is the seventeenth book in the Wimpy Kid series. Greg Heffley is finding out that the road to fame and glory comes with some hard knocks.



November Spotlight: Prediction

What is it?

The definition of prediction we use with the children in school is to 'use the information in a picture or a text to guess what is likely to happen next'



What happens in school?

Prediction is taught during CUSP reading lessons. Children are taught to look for clues, such as how characters are feeling, their actions or particular words or phrases. We talk about making sure our prediction is plausible based on the evidence.

How can I help at home?

Before you read a text, share either the title or the front cover of the text. What clues are you given about the text to come? While reading, pause during the text and ask what clues the author gives us about how the story may continue.
